IMPORTANT SAFETY GUIDELINES FOR CHURCH

These guidelines have been temporarily implemented to make our church environment safer.

1. Only every other pew will be used. You will be ushered to a pew when you enter the sanctuary. Pews will be filled from the front of the church to the back, so you might not be ushered to your favorite pew. We ask your patience as we adjust to this new situation. Pews will have 3 people per pew - one on each end and one in the middle, or two on one end (husband/ wife, etc.) and one on the other end. If there is a family group, they will all be seated in the same pew. **PLEASE WORK WITH US ON THIS.**
2. Bulletins will already be placed on your pew.
3. The seating capacity of the sanctuary will be limited to approximately 40 people. In case it becomes filled, there will be 5 or 6 seats available in the balcony and chairs will be available in the fellowship hall.
4. We will not take the offering during the service. Place your envelope in the offering plate located in the narthex and in the fellowship hall.

Leaving the Building

1. You will be ushered out of the sanctuary when the service is over. Ushering will start at the back. Please remain in your pew until it's your turn to exit. You will not be ushered out if you are in the balcony or the fellowship hall. If you are seated in either of those locations, please observe social distancing when you talk with others and exit the building.
2. If you are seated in the sanctuary or upstairs, please use either the main church doors to exit, or use the wide entrance into the fellowship hall. If you are seated in the fellowship hall, please exit using the glass doors by the library. Please do not use the narrow hallway with the coat rack.

CONGRATULATIONS: July 1 is Pastor Bright's 30th anniversary of his ordination. May he have at least 30 more years doing God's work!

VOTERS: At the Voters' meeting today, an amendment will be proposed to the Bylaws for the Christ Lutheran Church Endowment Fund. Details of the proposed change are posted in the Fellowship Hall.

MASKS: Thank you for all of the masks that have been made. 140 went to Concordia ministries; 400 to the Atlantic District and 80 to the congregation. Our goal is 1000. Keep on sewing!!!

WELCOME VISITORS! Please fill out a Welcome Card (located in the card holders in pews) and give to Pastor after the service and receive a special welcome gift. Children's bulletins and activity bags are available at the church entrance. A mother's room and restroom are located at the left rear of the church. If you do not have a church home, you are warmly invited to join with us.

FLOWERS: Flowers are given to the Glory of God by the Breights to celebrate Pastor's 30th anniversary of his ordination.

AS WE GATHER: Without the truly good news of the Gospel we cannot see the hard truth that we and all people are poor sinners who deserve nothing but punishment from almighty God. It takes the Gospel to open our eyes wide to the severity of God's Law, which our Savior took on Himself in our stead. In Jeremiah's day, and our own, false prophets proclaim an easy peace that requires little change in our daily living. Now, as when Paul was writing, some people in the Church think the freedom Christ won for us can mean a disregard for God's Law. And when Jesus was calling disciples, He had to warn them (and us) that some of their own family members would actively oppose their following the Lord. But the Gospel announces what is real and good: God has kept all His promises in our Savior Jesus Christ. His death shows the enormity of the punishment we deserve, and His resurrection assures us of eternal life. Because our Lord gave His life for us, with eyes wide open we can lose ourselves in service to Him and with the psalmist "sing of the steadfast love of the LORD, forever" (Psalm 89:1).

HOPE HOUSE: Diaper sizes 3, 4, & 5 or Pullups are being collected for Hope House at the Sunshine Kitchen. There is a table in the back of the Fellowship Hall. These will be taken to the Sunshine Kitchen on Monday, July 20, when Christ Lutheran serves the meal that day.

ADDRESS CHANGES: If your address changes, please contact the office. That way our membership list may be maintained.

HOTEL TOILETRY ITEMS – Those small toiletry items that the hotels and motels supply can be used by organizations that help the homeless, have soup kitchen, help low income families, etc. There is a bin in the library.
