

Because He Said So

"I don't want to take my dishes to the kitchen!" cried Billy. "WHY do I have to take my dishes to the kitchen? Why?" he exclaimed. The answer to Billy's question was immediate, firm and direct. "Because I said so," trumpeted Billy's father.

All of us have been on one or both ends of that kind of exchange. It was either said to us when we were a child or we have said it as a parent. "Because I said so!" It just tells it like it is.

As we enter into the time of Thanksgiving, it is good to consider one of the problems of giving thanks. We are most often of the mind that everything we do for God is out of thanks for His love and salvation. That sounds good. However, *what about the times when we DON'T feel thankful?* What about when we don't really appreciate what God has done for us and just take Him for granted? What about the times we are unable to feel thankful? Are we then somehow exempt from Christian love, service and worship? Of course not.

Christians obey God and keep His commandments because *Jesus tells us to do so*, not just because we may feel like it out of thanks. Christians obey God because He is their Father – "Because He said so." As earthly children are to be subject to their earthly fathers, so we are also subject to our heavenly Father and obey Him. When we were baptized, we didn't say we would renounce the devil and all his works and all his ways *as long as we felt thankful to God*. In confirmation, we didn't vow before the congregation and our Creator that we would conform our lives to the Word of God *as long as we felt thankful to Him*. However, isn't that oftentimes how we really live?

Our thankfulness is fickle. Fortunately for us, God's faithfulness is not. Despite all our shortcomings, God still loves us in Jesus Christ, who willingly sacrificed Himself for us on Calvary's cross. Baptized into Jesus we are now God's children. We are truly thankful to God for this blessing He gives us! Now, as His children, we obey Him and keep His commandments. Why? Because He said so!

Childcare awarded a second star

Congratulations to our Child Care Center Team! They have been designated with the Keystone STAR2 Award. It is an honor to be recognized for our quality of service to our community. We continue to learn and grow professionally. Our next goal is to work on achieving STAR3. This means that our staff is continuing to take trainings and college courses that help them in their professional growth in early childhood education. It also means that we are working to provide materials and equipment to provide quality care and education to our young children. Because of this Award, we are able to receive more subsidy payments and be able to apply for grant funding from Keystone STARS to help us purchase needed equipment and supplies to enhance our program. We hope to purchase new nap mats, diaper changing table, safety fence/gate for our toddler playground, supplies that show diversity (after all, Jesus loves all the children of the world... no matter color or age...), and these are just a few of items on our grant list.

Pray for safe travel for our school teachers. They will be attending the Professional Church Workers Conference November 5-7th.

Pray for thanksgiving that our staffing needs have been filled.
