I will be off-campus during a large part of the day on Monday through Friday, but I'm confident we can make it all work. It will take diligent time management and organization on my part, and patience, flexibility, understanding, and extra help when needed on yours. We ask the Lord of our church to bless and prosper our plans to His glory and the good of Christ Lutheran.




