C: (sung)Glory to You, O Lord.

Jesus claims He is from eternity.

Following the reading...

P: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

C: (sung)Praise to You, O Christ.

THE ATHANASIAN CREED

Left side: Whoever desires to be saved must, above all, hold the catholic faith.

Right side: Whoever does not keep it whole and undefiled will without doubt perish eternally.

Left side: And the catholic faith is this,

Right side: that we worship one God in Trinity and Trinity in Unity, neither confusing the persons nor dividing the substance.

Left side: For the Father is one person, the Son is another, and the Holy Spirit is another.

Right side: But the Godhead of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit is one: the glory equal, the majesty coeternal.

Left side: Such as the Father is, such is the Son, and such is the Holy Spirit:

Right side: the Father uncreated, the Son uncreated, the Holy Spirit uncreated;

Left side: the Father infinite, the Son infinite, the Holy Spirit infinite;

Right side: the Father eternal, the Son eternal, the Holy Spirit eternal.

Left side: And yet there are not three Eternals, but one Eternal,

Right side: just as there are not three Uncreated or three Infinites, but one Uncreated and one Infinite.

Left side: In the same way, the Father is almighty, the Son almighty, the Holy Spirit almighty;

Right side: and yet there are not three Almighties, but one Almighty.

Left side: So the Father is God, the Son is God, the Holy Spirit is God;

Right side: and yet there are not three Gods, but one God.

Left side: So the Father is Lord, the Son is Lord, the Holy Spirit is Lord;

Right side: and yet there are not three Lords, but one Lord.

Left side: Just as we are compelled by the Christian truth to acknowledge each distinct person as God and Lord, so also are we prohibited by the catholic religion to say that there are three Gods or Lords.

Right side: The Father is not made nor created nor begotten by anyone.

Left side: The Son is neither made nor created, but begotten of the Father alone.

Right side: The Holy Spirit is of the Father and of the Son, neither made nor created nor begotten, but proceeding.

Left side: Thus, there is one Father, not three Fathers; one Son, not three Sons; one Holy Spirit, not three Holy Spirits.

Right side: And in this Trinity none is before or after another; none is greater or less than another;

Left side: but the whole three persons are coeternal with each other and coequal, so that in all things, as has been stated above, the Trinity in Unity and Unity in Trinity is to be worshiped.

Right side: Therefore, whoever desires to be saved must think thus about the Trinity.

Left side: But it is also necessary for everlasting salvation that one faithfully believe the incarnation of our Lord Jesus Christ. Therefore, it is the right faith that we believe and confess that our Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of God, is at the same time both God and man.

Right side: He is God, begotten from the substance of the Father before all ages; and He is man, born from the substance of His mother in this age:

Left side: perfect God and perfect man, composed of a rational soul and human flesh;

Right side: equal to the Father with respect to His divinity, less than the Father with respect to His humanity.

Left side: Although He is God and man, He is not two, but one Christ:

Right side: one, however, not by the conversion of the divinity into flesh, but by the assumption of the humanity into God;

Left side: one altogether, not by confusion of substance, but by unity of person.

Right side: For as the rational soul and flesh is one man, so God and man is one Christ,

Left side: who suffered for our salvation, descended into hell, rose again the third day from the dead,

Right side: ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father, God Almighty, from whence He will come to judge the living and the dead.

Left side: At His coming all people will rise again with their bodies and give an account concerning their own deeds.

Right side: And those who have done good will enter into eternal life, and those who have done evil into eternal fire.

All: This is the catholic faith; whoever does not believe it faithfully and firmly cannot be saved.

THE SERVICE OF HOLY COMMUNION

The Lord's Supper (Holy Communion) is being celebrated in today's service. In preparation for that, please be reminded that the bread and wine of the Lord's Supper are not merely representations or symbols of Jesus' body and blood but Jesus' body and blood sacrificed on the cross are present in, with, and under the bread and wine (The Real Presence). How is this possible? This is beyond human understanding, but we remember that with God all things are possible. This truth is a divine mystery instituted by Jesus, taught by his Apostles, fervently held by the Christian church, and one in which we participate through faith. To be properly prepared to receive this sacrament, you must

- 1)Recognize that you have indeed sinned against God and other people and are accountable to God for those sins;
- 2) Be sorry (repentant) for those sins;
- 3) Believe that in this sacrament Jesus bestows forgiveness, life, and salvation; and
- 4) Sincerely desire to live a godly life from this point forward.

If you are not a member of Christ Lutheran Church, please speak with the pastor before receiving communion here for the first time. If you choose to come forward to receive a blessing rather than the Lord's Supper, indicate this by crossing your arms over your chest.

DISTRIBUTION

After communion, exit through the right doorway, place individual communion cups in the tray, and proceed down the stairs back to your seat.
