AS WE GATHER

From Old Testament history to the present, ashes have been a sign of contrition. Although some might call them Roman Catholic, ashes are an ancient symbol in the Bible. Sackcloth and ashes were not only a sign of sorrow over sin but also a mark of faith looking for forgiveness from God. Ashes are not sacramental. They are not essential. Ashes are offered for those who mourn over their sins and find them a meaningful expression—of the reality of their sin, of their personal responsibility for their sin, over the hurtful effects of sin, and of their faith in God's grace and forgiveness.

The mood of this service is somber as we reflect upon the quality of our faith and life. We consider discipline—the discipline of faith and living as a child of God as well as the special discipline of our Lenten season. We keep the focus on redemption, on the gift of God in our Baptism, and in the renewal of our faith and lives.

CONFESSION

P: Brothers and sisters: God created us to experience joy in communion with Him, to love all humanity, and to live in harmony with all of His creation. However, sin separates us from God, our neighbors, and creation, so we do not enjoy the life our Creator intended for us. Also, by our sin we grieve our Father, who does not desire us to come under judgment, but to turn to Him and live.

As disciples of the Lord Jesus we are called to struggle against everything that leads us away from the love of God and neighbor. Repentance, fasting, prayer, and works of love – the disciplines of Lent – help us to wage our

spiritual warfare. I invite you, therefore, to commit yourselves to this struggle and confess your sins, asking your Father for strength to preserve you in your Lenten discipline.

(We take a moment of silence before the Lord as we call to mind how we have not properly loved Him, ourselves, or other people.)

P: Most holy and merciful Father

C: We confess to You and to one another and to the whole communion of saints in heaven and on earth that we have sinned by our own fault in thought, word, and deed; by what we have done, and by what we have left undone.

P: We have not loved You with our whole heart and mind and strength. We have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We have not forgiven others as we have been forgiven.

C: Have mercy on us, O Lord.

P: We have been deaf to Your call to serve as Christ served us. We have not been true to the mind of Christ. We have grieved Your Holy Spirit. We confess to You, Lord, all our past unfaithfulness; the pride, hypocrisy, and impatience in our lives,

A: We confess to You, O Lord.

P: Our self-indulgent appetites and habits; our exploitation of other people,

A: We confess to You, O Lord.

P: Our anger at our own frustration and our envy of those more fortunate than ourselves,

A: We confess to You, O Lord.

P: Our uncontrolled love of worldly goods and comforts and our dishonesty in daily life and work,

A: We confess to You, O Lord.

P: Our negligence in prayer and worship and our failure to commend to others the faith that is in us,

A: We confess to You, O Lord.

P: Accept our repentance, Lord, for the wrongs we have done. For our blindness to human need and suffering, and our indifference to injustice and cruelty,

A: Accept our repentance, O Lord.

P: For false judgments, for uncharitable thoughts towards our neighbors and for our prejudice and contempt toward those who differ from us,

A: Accept our repentance, O Lord.

P: Restore us, good Lord, and let Your anger depart from us.

A: Hear us, Lord, for Your mercy is great. Amen

THE IMPOSITION OF ASHES

All who desire to receive ashes come forward down the center aisle, receive the ashes either on the forehead or hand, and return to their seat using the side or center aisle.

Ashes are placed on the forehead or hand of each person with the words, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you will return."

P: Almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, does not desire the death of sinners, but rather that they turn from their wickedness and live.

Therefore, we implore Him to grant us true repentance and His Holy Spirit, that those things we do on this day may please Him, that the rest of our life may be pure and holy, and that at the last we may come to His eternal joy; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

C: Amen.

FIRST READING

Joel 2:12-19

L: The first reading for Ash Wednesday is from chapter two of Joel.

In this reading we are told to return to the Lord.

“Yet even now,” declares the Lord, “return to Me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning; and rend your hearts and not your garments.” Return to the Lord your God, for He is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love; and He relents over disaster. Who knows whether he will not turn and relent, and leave a blessing behind him, a grain offering and a drink offering for the Lord your God?

Blow the trumpet in Zion; consecrate a fast; call a solemn assembly; gather the people. Consecrate the congregation; assemble the elders; gather the children, even nursing infants. Let the bridegroom leave his room, and the bride her chamber.

Between the vestibule and the altar let the priests, the ministers of the Lord, weep and say, “Spare your people, O Lord, and make not your heritage a reproach, a byword among the nations. Why should they say among the peoples, ‘Where is their God?’”

Then the Lord became jealous for His land and had pity on His people. The Lord answered and said to His people, “Behold, I am sending to you grain, wine, and oil, and you will be satisfied; and I will no more make you a reproach among the nations.

SECOND READING

2 Corinthians 5:20b-6:10

L: The second reading is from 2 Corinthians chapter 5.

We are encouraged to be ambassadors for Christ.

Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ, God making His appeal through us. We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. For our sake He made Him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in Him we might become the righteousness of God.

Working together with Him, then, we appeal to you not to receive the grace of God in vain. For He says,

“In a favorable time I listened to you, and in a day of salvation I have helped you.”

Behold, now is the favorable time; behold, now is the day of salvation. We put no obstacle in anyone's way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry, but as servants of God we commend ourselves in every way: by great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities, beatings, imprisonments, riots, labors, sleepless nights, hunger; by purity, knowledge, patience, kindness, the Holy Spirit, genuine love; by truthful speech, and the power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and for the left; through honor and dishonor, through slander and praise. We are treated as impostors, and yet are true; as unknown, and yet well known; as dying, and behold, we live; as punished, and yet not killed; as sorrowful,

yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, yet possessing everything.

HOLY GOSPEL *(please stand)*

Matthew 6:1-6, 16-21

P: The Holy Gospel is according to St. Matthew, chapter six.

C: Glory to You, O Lord.

In this Gospel Jesus teaches us about alms, fasting and the treasures of our hearts.

Giving to the Needy

“Beware of practicing your righteousness before other people in order to be seen by them, for then you will have no reward from your Father who is in heaven. “Thus, when you give to the needy, sound no trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, that they may be praised by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. But when you give to the needy, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, so that your giving may be in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

The Lord's Prayer

“And when you pray, you must not be like the hypocrites. For they love to stand and pray in the synagogues and at the street corners, that they may be seen by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. But when you pray, go into your room and shut the door and pray to your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

Fasting

“And when you fast, do not look gloomy like the hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces that their fasting may be seen by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. But when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, that your fasting may not be seen by others but by your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

Lay Up Treasures in Heaven

“Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal, but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

SERVICE OF HOLY COMMUNION

The Lord's Supper (Holy Communion) is being celebrated in today's service. In preparation for that, please be reminded that the bread and wine of the Lord's Supper are not merely representations or symbols of Jesus' body and blood but Jesus' body and blood sacrificed on the cross are present in, with, and under the bread and wine (The Real Presence). How is this possible? This is beyond human understanding, but we remember that with God all things are possible. This truth is a divine mystery instituted by Jesus, taught by his Apostles, fervently held by the Christian church, and one in which we participate through faith. To be properly prepared to receive this sacrament, you must

- 1) Recognize that you have indeed sinned against God and other people and are accountable to God for those sins;
- 2) Be sorry (repentant) for those sins;
- 3) Believe that in this sacrament Jesus bestows forgiveness, life, and salvation; and
- 4) Sincerely desire to live a godly life from this point forward.

If you are not a member of Christ Lutheran Church, please speak with the pastor before receiving communion here for the first time.
